We all too often see Pets out on Walks during High Temperatures with Ground Temperatures exceeding Pets Comfort and Safety Levels causing Paw burning and blistering.

Something to think about before taking a Pet out on a Walk or letting them out to Pottie Unsupervised:

There is a simple test in which you can do to check whether the pavement is too hot for your pet's paws by doing a "5-7-second test". Simply touch the pavement with the back of your hand for 5-7 seconds or if the ground is too hot for you to walk on Barefoot then it's likely too hot for your pet and can cause harm to their Paw Pads.

If your Pet does encounter a burn injury, consult your Veterinary Hospital as soon as possible for advice on Proper Treatment to avoid Infections and help them Heal faster.

### **Why Everyone Should Know About TNR**

n case you hadn't heard, it's "kitten season!" What might initially sound delightfully adorable is actually a huge crisis every shelter and rescue is scrambling to deal with right now. It's during this time that a massive influx of kittens are born outside. For Southern California, kitten season is pretty much all

year round but especially difficult to manage from Spring to Late Summer or Early Autumn.

If you've recently spotted a pregnant queen or found a litter and tried to find someone to take them in, you already know that everyone -

shelters, rescues, foster volunteers - is currently beyond maximum capacity. Sadly, there is just nowhere for many of these easily savable kittens to go. So, now that we know about the problem, what can we do?

Adoption and fostering are excellent ways to help but, only if you're ready for the commitment and there are just so many you can take in yourself before it becomes inhumane and out of control. So let's start at the source. Trap. Neuter. Return. or TNR is the process of humanely trapping feral, stray and community cats in order to sterilize (spay or neuter) them to help curb overpopulation. Once they have been vetted and their recovery briefly monitored, they are released back into their original environment.

So, how does it work? Well, there are many organizations, large to small, throughout the country who regularly

perform TNR in all types of neighborhoods and communities. A quick Google search can help you locate a group in your area. Some will charge a fee to come and trap around your home for you or let you rent traps but most will be happy to train you on how to properly trap and lend you equipment.

The training is very useful and not at all difficult or too time-consuming. A reputable and experienced rescue like Forgotten Angels Cat Rescue based in Palmdale will make sure you have all the information, supplies and support you need

to begin a successful TNR project. They can also help connect you with free (that's right, no cost to you) spay/neuter clinics in the Antelope Valley.

Kittens and some adult cats can be adopted out after they have been properly socialized and vetted. It's a great idea to be prepared to foster, if you can, or enlist the help of a friend orfamily member who may be able to help any friendly felines you may come across.

TNR not only helps get the most vulnerable the aid they need but is also beneficial in disease prevention and assuaging aggressive behaviors. Your newly neutered neighbors will be happier and healthier for it.

If you are unable to get involved with doing TNR, please consider donating to a charity that does. Even a small act of donating a couple dollars toward TNR





That was the beginning of what is Windswept Ranch today. I have been so blessed to share my animals in so many ways. I have watched a child take her first steps after multiple surgeries with one of my lambs by her side. I have shared a last wish with a Make a

Wish child who wanted to help Santa train reindeer. I have seen a busload of hearing impaired children hand feed deer that had never let me near, and watched a blind girl do "Braile" on my reindeer, memorizing everything about him. I have seen miracles and come to know that each encounter with these amazing beings makes us better.

And it should come as no surprise that each Saturday when the ranch opens for tours, I watch as people get close to animals they may have never seen or touched, getting kissed by camels, feeling the texture of zebra stripes, touching a bison..... And, I have seen them touched by these animals.

There are always surprises for visitors, whether volunteering or touring. I still remember the first day two volunteers started helping at the ranch. The yak escaped

and we all spent the day rounding up six wild yak. Or the time an alpaca went into labor and needed help. Two visitors jumped in to help make a temporary stall for the momma while I helped with the birth and moved her to her new accommodations. surprises for us everyone involved.



**A**: Snobal - White Spitz & Samoyed mix recovered in 1984 from Ridgecrest, CA (Kern County Animal Shelter)

**B**: Snobal - left home in 1985 to "SOW WILD OATS!" When she came home, she was followed by a rust, grey and brown timber wolf! and 2 months later, she whelped 11 puppies! Nine lived. We kept Moby, the largest of her brood.

"Rusty" stayed around and wouldn't let anyone near her but me (John), and promptly left when she was done. I had to play "mid wife" because the pups were too big for the birth canal.

When we moved to Palmdale in 1986, our time was spent raising our 4 kids and these 2 precious dogs. Snobal developed a mast in her neck and we turned her over to a vet who lived in Northridge rather than euthanasia. In Jan, 1994, the Northridge area suffered a 6.7 earthquake at 4:30 am. Snobal started to bark, woke the family as she jumped on their bed just before the quake hit. They jumped out of the bed as the ceiling fell in killing Snobal!

We moved to Lancaster, CA to manage a group of homes and as we started cleaning out the gang bangers and drug dealers, someone threw mothballs into our yard and Moby took them for treats, ate them and we found him dead on the front lawn the next morning.

C:We've been a family of rescues since ~ forever! Annie was found in Palmdale by our middle son Kevin and his friend, Saunders. We don't know all the details (they wouldn't tell us). Something about bikers getting her high. Could never verify, but they brought her to us in Aug 1991. They think she was born 1989 but we had her until she died in 2008!

We met Dr. Bosma in 1987 and he and staff took care of her and her dental health from the beginning. We believe her 20 years of health was due to her dental hygiene...

**D**: Maggie came to us shortly after Annie went home. Dr Bosma brought Maggie over as a foster. We fell in love with her. She seemed to look up at us to say, **(E)** "HEY, You Lookin' at ME???" Her first snow was in 2011**(F)**. She got sick and died of liver failure in Nov, 2015.

G: Riki #1 came to us in 2016 from Cloud 2 Ground Rescue and we fell in love with him instantly! His personality was so power-ful and magnetic that he just quickly adopted us! After research, we found out he was a Jagd Terrier. We had him for 4 years and, in 2020, he found a box of Carmel popcorn, ate the ENTIRE BOX! When we got home from the drs appointment, he was incoherant and drooling. We took him to NVVC ER. Dr bosma thought he was in a diabetic crisis but he eventually died from pancreatitis.

H: Winnie was a miniature Spanish Greyhound entirely too nervous for seniors. as well as (I) - Riki #2. A 18 wk old Chi-pug more like a teenager on 8 cups of caffeine!!! Needless to say, we had to surrender him or die trying to keep up!

J: Our latest bundle of energy, is -YEP - another Riki. OK, we have a harness with RIKI and our phone #! He is an energetic and recovering from abuse, but worth the time. HE IS PRECIOUS! As well as a pain in the #@&%. But that's what fostering is all about!
